Report of Director of (Environment and Planning)

- 1. <u>PURPOSE OF REPORT</u>
- 1.1 To request Executive agrees to an increase in the Parish and Community Initiative Fund 2017/18 by £38,013.

2. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

- 2.1 That Executive agrees the additional funding of the 13 schemes outlined in 3.4.
- 2.2 That Executive agrees the utilisation of £38,013 from the Developing Communities fund to fund these Parish and Community Initiative schemes.
- 3. BACKGROUND TO THE REPORT
- 3.1 Since 2005 the Parish Community Initiative Fund has distributed over £1,016,000 towards 261 local parishes or community projects.
- 3.2 For 2017/18 55 applications have been received requesting a total of £239,445.
- 3.3 Grants totalling £125,000 for 28 projects have been agreed by Senior Leadership Team in line with the schemes conditions.
- 3.4 The assessment panel felt the following 17 projects met the criteria of the fund sufficiently to be considered for funding of £38,013 if further funds were made available. These projects remain within the £12,000 per parish limit and have scored slightly lower than those already awarded the £125,000 against the scoring criteria. Applications are set out in alphabetical order by parish and parish name is given in brackets.
 - 1 Speed Activation Signs Bagworth and Thornton Parish Council (Bagworth and Thornton)

Outline: The installation of 2 x speed activation signs at Station Road, Bagworth and Main Street, Thornton. £5,370

- 2 Roundhouse refurbishments Barlestone Parish Council (Barlestone) Outline: The installation of seating and new planters in the area known as the Roundhouse in the centre of Barlestone. £1,899
- 3 Church Hall renovations and exhibition boards Cadeby Parish Council (Cadeby) Outline: Improvements to the interior of the Church Hall including decorating and the installation of storage cupboards and the supply of exhibition boards for interpreting the story of Cadeby. £2,000
- 4 Kiosk Refurbishment Project Carlton Parish Council (Carlton) Outline: Refurbishment of former telephone box used to house leaflet rack, noticeboard and community defibrillator. £324
- 5 Cemetery Hedgelaying Project Carlton Parish Council (Carlton) Outline: Laying of a hedge at Carlton Parish Cemetery to improve security and to benefit wildlife. £108
- 6 Carlton Oaks Project Carlton Parish Council (Carlton) Outline: The planting of 5 x native Oak trees in prominent locations within the village of Carlton. £297
- 7 Desford in Bloom Desford in Bloom (Desford) Outline: The provision of hanging baskets, tools and water butts, to assist with the Desford in Bloom initiative. £1,469
- 8 Redecoration of Vestry Desford Free Church (Desford) Outline: The redecoration of rooms including painting and new curtains to improve the facility for community use. £1,302
- 9 Facility Improvements Rainbows Baby and Toddler Group (Desford) Outline: The provision of new floor mats, tough trays and storage boxes at St. Martin's Church Centre in Desford, for use by the Rainbows Baby and Toddler Group. £311
- 10 Earl Shilton in Bloom Earl Shilton in Bloom Volunteers group (Earl Shilton) Outline: The provision of hanging baskets, irrigation system and tools to assist with the Earl Shilton in Bloom initiative. £2,082
- 11 Archaeological Dig in Market Bosworth Market Bosworth Society (Market Bosworth)
 Outline: A community archaeological dig to take place at a number of sites within Market Bosworth, to help discover the very early history of the settlement. £9,210
- 12 Peckleton Public Seating Peckleton Parish Council (Peckleton) Outline: To provide community seating at Kirkby Mallory recreation ground and Kirkby Mallory Village Centre. £731
- 13 All Saints Church Sound System Sheepy District Church Council (Sheepy) Outline: The installation of a sound system to the church building to improve the acoustics and for the benefit of the hard of hearing. £1,049. This is additional funding applied for, for this scheme.

- 14 Renovation of Frontage Without Walls Christian Fellowship (Stanton-under-Bardon) Outline: Repairs and reinstatement of render to the front of the building, and repaint. £1,635
- 15 Renovation of Social Area in Church St Margaret's Parochial Church Council (Stoke Golding) Outline: The renovation of the area to the back of the church to provide a more welcoming community space, to include new carpeting, storage cupboards and the re-routing of the water supply to the outside tap. £2,506
- 16 New Equipment at Village Hall Norton Juxta Twycross Village Institute Committee (Twycross)
 Outline: Tables and signs to assist with fund raising events to raise money to help run the village Hall. £700
- 17 Kennel Lane Footpath Witherley Parish Council (Witherley) Outline: The creation of a section of footpath, within grass area, to improve safety along Kennel Lane in Witherley. £7,020
- 3.5 These additional schemes can be funded from the Developing Communities Fund. The expressions of interest submitted for the Developing Communities Fund indicate that £1,330,225 of the £1,400,000 fund is likely to be awarded. This potentially leaves £69,775 uncommitted.
- 4. <u>EXEMPTIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ACCESS TO INFORMATION</u> <u>PROCEDURE RULES</u>
- 4.1 This report will be taken in open session.
- 5. <u>FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS [CS]</u>

2017/18 Schemes

- 5.1 For 2017/18, within the existing capital programme there is £125,000 set aside for the schemes outlined in 3.3.
- 5.2 Currently no budget has been allocated for the additional schemes totalling £38,013 outlined within 3.4. Therefore, for these schemes a supplementary growth bid will require approval by Council. The total cost of financing £38,013 is estimated to be £2,630 per year for 25 years (£1,110 interest and £1,520 principal/ MRP).

6. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS [AR]

- 6.1 The Council has a wide power within section 2 of the Local Government Act 2000. This is known as the 'well being power' and seeks to promote or improve the economic, social, and environmental well being of the Council's area. The statutory power includes providing financial assistance to achieve this purpose.
- 6.2 In addition to the 'well being power' the Council is also able to utilise the General Power of Competence under the Localism Act 2011. This represents a more recent statutory power and further strengthens the ability of the Council to provide financial assistance as set out within this report.
- 7. <u>CORPORATE PLAN IMPLICATIONS</u>

- 7.1 The Parish & Community Initiative fund supports parishes and community groups to achieve the following aims and objectives of the Corporate Performance Plan:
 - Creating a vibrant place to work and live
 - Empowering Communities
 - Providing value for money and pro-active services
- 8. <u>CONSULTATION</u>
- 8.1 Scrutiny Commission is consulted as part of the decision to agree grant applications.
- 8.2 Parish Councils and other applicants have previously been consulted on this funding scheme.
- 9. <u>RISK IMPLICATIONS</u>
- 9.1 It is the Council's policy to proactively identify and manage significant risks which may prevent delivery of business objectives.
- 9.2 It is not possible to eliminate or manage all risks all of the time and risks will remain which have not been identified.
