52 <u>TOWN & COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 - APPLICATIONS TO BE DETERMINED</u> (PR6)

The Committee considered the schedule of planning applications, together with the list of late items and the recommendations of the Head of Planning & Leisure.

For Members' information the Head of Planning & Leisure indicated that in the case of items 4 and 8 on the schedule he would recommend a condition be attached to each of the planning permissions (should approval be now given by the Committee) in such terms as he in consultation with the Director of Resources and the Principal Solicitor shall decide to ensure that the on-site car parking provision is allocated to flats on the site in perpetuity.

(a) <u>04/00101/OUT - Residential development for 7 dwellings, 8 Statham Builders Yard, Cuthberts Yard, off Newbold Road, Barlestone - Mr. J. Singh and Mrs. D.B. Kaur</u>

On the motion of Mr. Crooks, seconded by Mr. Stanley it was

<u>RESOLVED</u> - this application be refused for the reasons indicated below, but further discussions be held with the applicants with regard to a possible revised scheme:-

- 1. In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority the proposed scheme is likely to have an overbearing effect on the occupiers of neighbouring dwellings, due to their proximity and height, and is therefore contrary to policies BE1 and RES5 of the adopted Hinckley & Bosworth Local Plan, and the Borough Council's Supplementary Planning Guidance on Residential Development.
- 2. In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, the proposed scheme does not provide adequate car parking and manoeuvring space without resulting in conflict with other users of Cuthberts Yard and would therefore be contrary to policy T5 and BE1 of the adopted Hinckley & Bosworth Local Plan.

Mr. Bill, Mr. Crooks, Mr. Joyce, Mrs. Finney and Mr. Stanley, having declared an interest in planning application No. 04/00559/FUL, withdrew from the meeting at 7.40 p.m., whilst this was considered. Messrs. Crooks, Joyce and Stanley returned at 7.41 p.m. and Mrs. Finney at 7.43 p.m.

<u>RESOLVED</u> - the remaining recommendations of the Head of Planning & Leisure as set out in the schedule submitted, as amended by the list of late items, be approved with the exception of application No. 04/00101/OUT above.

53 <u>SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING GUIDANCE ON TELECOMMUNICATIONS FOR HINCKLEY AND BOSWORTH (PR7)</u>

Further to minute No. 462 of 23rd March 2004, the Head of Planning & Leisure reported on representations received in consequence of the consultation exercise recently undertaken with regard to the above. Committee authority to adopt this document as Supplementary Planning Guidance was now sought.
