Although generally supportive of this development Members expressed concerns regarding the width of the proposed landscaping strip, the variance between levels of land and permitted development rights, and on the motion of Mrs. Wright, seconded by Mr. Furniss, it was

<u>RESOLVED</u> - this application be approved in accordance with the recommendation of the Acting Head of Planning and Leisure subject to the following additional conditions:-

- 23 No development shall commence on site until such time as the existing and proposed ground levels and proposed finished floor levels for the dwellings hereby approved adjoining the southern boundary have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The ground and finished floor levels shall then be implemented in accordance with the approved details.
- 24 Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town & Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 development within Schedule 2, Part 1, Class A-E, shall not be carried out before planning permission for such development has first been granted by the Local Planning Authority.
- 25 Notwithstanding the provisions of Schedule 2, Part 1 of the Town & Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 (or any Order revoking and re-enacting that Order), no windows other than those shown on the approved plans shall be inserted into plots 1-44 without the prior permission of the Local Planning Authority having been granted on a specific application.
- 26 No development shall commence until the finished roof heights of the proposed dwellings on plots 1-44 have been submitted and approved in writing with the Local Planning Authority, and implemented in accordance with the agreed details.
- 27 The boundary treatment indicated on plan reference D008 received by the Local Planning Authority on 21st January 2005 showing a 1.8 metre high close boarded fence shall be erected within seven days following commencement of development unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.
