On the motion of Mr. D.R. Bown, seconded by Mr. Crooks, it was

<u>RESOLVED</u> - in order to accommodate a member of the public wishing to speak and needing to travel, item 19 on the schedule be considered first.

(a) <u>04/01503/OUT - Commercial and residential development, Dawkins International</u> <u>Ltd., Barton Road, Congerstone - Dawkins International Ltd.</u>

Although generally supportive of the proposal the Committee expressed concerns regarding construction vehicles' route onto the site and vehicle parking off-site and on the motion of Mr. Furniss seconded by Mr. Ward it was

<u>RESOLVED</u> - this application be approved in accordance with the recommendation of the Acting Head of Planning and Leisure subject to the following additional condition and note to applicant:-

No development shall take place until details of a scheme for the routing of construction traffic and measures to be taken to prevent the deposit of materials, i.e. mud from vehicles leaving the site during construction works being deposited on the public highway have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Such measures shall be retained and fully implemented for the duration of the construction period.

Note to Applicant

The applicant is advised that in view of the location of the site and the need to reduce the impact on the nearby residents, construction vehicles should be parked and load/unload within the application site.

(b) <u>04/00231/FUL - Residential development of 43 dwellings and associated works,</u> <u>Bagworth Colliery Site, Station Road, Bagworth - Bellway Homes (East</u> <u>Midlands) Limited</u>

Although generally sympathetic to this development, concerns were raised that should planning permission be granted, the financial contribution towards open space provision should be used instead to enhance community facilities. Additionally, affordable housing units should be made available in the first instance to local people on the Council's current housing list. It was moved by Mr. Boothby, seconded by Mrs. Claridge and

<u>RESOLVED</u> - this application be approved in accordance with the recommendation of the Acting Head of Planning and Leisure and the financial contribution towards public open space provision used instead towards community facilities in Bagworth. In addition, the affordable housing units shall be made available, initially, for residents of Bagworth in accordance with the Borough Council's cascade approach to this type of housing provision. These aspects of the development to be covered as part of the Section 106 Legal Agreement accompanying the planning permission.

Mr. Bill withdrew from the meeting at 7.15 p.m. and returned at 7.16 p.m.

(c) <u>04/00994/FUL - Residential development of 162 no. dwellings, land off</u> Montgomery Road, Earl Shilton - David Wilson Homes

An objector listed to speak on this application did not attend.

In view of outstanding issues to be resolved between interested parties, it was moved by Mr. Ellis seconded by Mr. D.R. Bown and

<u>RESOLVED</u> - consideration of this application be deferred for one month to allow for further discussions between the parties referred to above.

(d) <u>04/01397/COU - Change of use to (A3) hot food takeaway, Allotments Florists,</u> <u>57 Wood Street, Earl Shilton - Mr. W.S. Fan</u>

On the motion of Mr. D.R. Bown, seconded by Mr. Ellis, it was

RESOLVED - this application be refused for the following reasons:-

- 1 In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority the proposal would result in an over concentration of non-retail Class A3 uses within the Earl Shilton Local Shopping Centre which would jeopardise the balance of shopping and other uses by eroding the retail activity and character of the locality. Therefore the proposal is contrary to policy RET8 of the adopted Hinckley and Bosworth Local Plan.
- 2 In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority the proposal would have a seriously detrimental effect on the amenities enjoyed by occupiers of adjoining residential properties and the general character of the locality in terms of general disturbance and traffic generation. Therefore the proposal is contrary to policies RET8, RET1O and BE1 of the adopted Hinckley and Bosworth Local Plan.

Mr. Bill left the meeting at 7.45 p.m., returning at 7.52 p.m.

Mrs. Claridge declared an interest in planning application no. 04/01455/COU and left the meeting at 8.00 p.m., as did Mrs. Sherwin who had indicated her interest earlier. Mr. Hunnybun left the meeting at 8.04 p.m., returning at 8.08 p.m., as did Mrs. Claridge and Mrs. Sherwin. Mr. Ward withdrew from the meeting at 8.12 p.m.

In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, an extension to the existing opening hours would have a detrimental effect on the character of the area and amenities of the occupiers of nearby properties within the Hinckley Town Centre by reason of potential litter and disturbance. Therefore the proposal would not accord with policies BE1 and RET10 of the adopted Hinckley and Bosworth Local Plan and the Supplementary Planning Guidance on Shopping and Shop fronts (adopted January 2003).
