# 473 <u>05/00489/GDOT: ERECTION OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS MAST ON STREET</u> VERGE, RUGBY ROAD, BURBAGE (P84)

The Committee was informed of progress on the appeal lodged against refusal of planning permission for the above development and Members were advised of additional information that had come forward since the decision was made.

At the request of Messrs. D.R. Bown, Ellis, Furniss and Hinton, a vote on the recommendation contained in the report was taken and recorded as follows:-

# 474 <u>TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 - APPLICATIONS TO BE</u> <u>DETERMINED (P81)</u>

(a) <u>05/01342/FUL – Severn Trent Water Sewage Treatment Works, Congerstone</u> Lane, Carlton, Nuneaton – Mrs. J. Ferrarin

<u>RESOLVED</u> – this application be approved in accordance with the recommendation of the Head of Culture and Development, together with the following additional condition:

## Condition

In the event that any of the significant trees screening the site are removed, the telecommunications mast and equipment hereby permitted shall be immediately removed and the land restored to its former condition, unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.

### <u>Reason</u>

In the interests of visual amenity, to accord with Policies NE5 and BE23 of the adopted Hinckley and Bosworth Local Plan.

#### (b) <u>06/00095/COU – Land Adjacent Ratby Co-op Band, Taverner Drive, Ratby –</u> <u>Ratby Parish Council</u>

Although in favour of the recommendation of the Head of Culture and Development, in the light of concerns raised with regard to the number of car parking spaces proposed, the Head of Culture and Development undertook to strengthen the appropriate condition relating to this as follows:

### **Condition**

Notwithstanding the details submitted upon completion of development should the applicant require further parking provision, details should be submitted and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

#### <u>Reason</u>

To ensure that adequate off-street parking facilities are available to accord with policy T5 of the adopted Hinckley & Bosworth Local Plan.

(c) <u>06/00110/FUL – Hope Community Church and Family Centre, Deveron Way,</u> <u>Hinckley – Mr. D. Warren</u>

Notwithstanding the officer's recommendation that this should be approved, the Committee was of the opinion that this development would be detrimental to residential amenity and did not provide sufficient parking. It was moved by Mrs. Cook, seconded by Mrs. Aldridge and

<u>RESOLVED</u> – the application be refused for the following reasons:

#### Reasons

(i) In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, the applicant has failed to demonstrate that an appropriate level of on-site car parking provision can be made, potentially leading to vehicles loading, unloading and parking in the Public Highway to the detriment of Highway safety, contrary to the intentions of Policies BE1, CF1 and T5 of the adopted Hinckley and Bosworth Local Plan.

(ii) In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, by reason of proximity, design and the likely generation of noise resulting from use of the facility throughout the proposed operating times, the proposed development would have a detrimental impact on the residential amenity of the adjacent properties, contrary to the intentions of Policies BE1 and CF1 of the adopted Hinckley and Bosworth Local Plan.

Mr. Joyce returned to the meeting at 7.55p.m. Having declared an interest in the following application, Mrs. Camamile left the meeting at 7.55p.m.

# (d) <u>06/00151/FUL – Barn at Hall Farm, Church Road, Peckleton – Mr. T.</u> <u>Morrison</u>

Although in support of the recommendation of the Head of Culture and Development that this application be approved, it was agreed that, as requested by the Parish Council, a note to applicant be included to ensure no commercial use of the site.
