Stables and kennels to Bradgate House, Bradgate Hill, Groby - Hinckley and Bosworth

Complex of brick stables and kennels built 1856 to house the 7th Earl of Stamford's 47 horses. Largely ruinous by 1988 and now derelict and in very bad condition notwithstanding consolidation work undertaken in the early 2000s. The complex has not been maintained for many years and is actively deteriorating. There are multiple structural concerns and periodic collapses of masonry. There is uncontrolled and significant ivy growth and self-seeded trees. The local authority has served an Urgent Works Notice. Historic England has awarded grant aid and is providing technical advice.
