Hinckley & Bosworth **Green Space Strategy** 2023 to 2033

Scope

This strategy identifies Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council's (HBBC) Green Space priorities for the next 10 years, as well as providing advice to Town & Parish Councils to develop their own green spaces.

Purpose

The purpose of the Strategy is to provide a clear vision and to set out the policies and actions for the delivery and management of sustainable green space for the next 10 years.

This strategy is underpinned by several supporting documents which outlines the national and local context. It also summaries key issues and challenges, before setting out how delivery will be achieved against the key themes.

Vision

To enhance and enrich the lives of residents and visitors to the borough via the delivery of quality green spaces through working with partners and engagement with our communities.

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We will seek to:

- Reduce our impact on the environment by cutting waste and encouraging recycling on our green spaces and in our ground's maintenance service.
- Manage our natural and semi natural green space to enhance biodiversity and nature conservation.
- Change our ground maintenance practices reducing the environmental impact of our operations.
- Work in close partnership with our partners to maximise biodiversity across our green spaces
- Work in close partnership with our partners to manage flood defences to HBBC land (blue infrastructure).
- Adapt traditional landscaping schemes to take account of the projected climate changes.
- Provide adequate shaded areas to our sites for periods of high temperatures.
- Ensure that our green space buildings are adapted for climate change and utilised in terms of solar power and water harvesting.
- Explore and utilise new technology to ensure that our green spaces and ground maintenance service are more sustainable
- Mitigate against HBBC carbon emissions by increasing the number of trees and wildflower areas to HBBC sites.

We will seek to:

- Work with other organisations to help facilitate strategic, green infrastructure.
- Contribute to increasing the multi-functional nature of existing green space by increasing natural and semi-natural elements through management, maintenance, and the connectivity between sites.
- Increase and facilitate our tree canopy in the borough to the national average of 13.5%.

- Increase the opportunities for community to engage in physical activity across our sites.
- Increase relaxing and calming areas within our green spaces for contemplation and enhance mental wellbeing.



Cross cutting themes

Protect, increase, maintain and celebrate our Green Spaces Green Space is undeveloped land in an otherwise urban environment, not necessarily provided for formal recreation or public amenity, this makes a positive visual and environmental contribution to local residents for recreational or aesthetic purposes.

Increase biodiversity and sustainability - reducing environmental impact

Biodiversity means the richness and variety of life - of genes, species and ecosystems. Sustainability is the ability to maintain ecological processes over long periods of time.

Increase and improve Green Infrastructure

The key features of green infrastructure are that it is a network of integrated spaces and features, not just individual elements; and that it is 'multi-functional'. These can be to: support people's mental and physical health, encourage active travel, cool urban areas during heat waves, attract investment, reduce water run-off during flash flooding, carbon storage, and provide sustainable drainage.

Encourage active and healthy lifestyles

A healthy lifestyle is a valuable resource for reducing the incidence and impact of health problems, for recovery, for coping with life stresses, and for improving quality of life.
